We provide parents/caregivers a temporary break from their children. The break is designed to give the caregiver time to rejuvenate their emotions, thoughts and energy. When parents reach the point of losing control and taking anger and frustration out on their child, we would provide a short break to regain control.

We provide families the opportunity to remain together as a family. Respite care deters family crisis which might lead to abuse or neglect.
